O Gauge:(Rich H.)

More progress achieved on the O layout scenery and yard tracks with more progress with electrical elements anticipated soon.

HO Scale:(Richard T.)

The HO team reports expansion of the upper level scenery, including hydrocal applied near JK junction with new switches installed at Laurel and Indian Creek yards. Upper level fascia painting is also advancing with areas in need of a second coat. Ballast is mixed and ready to apply. Remember to leave switches un-ballasted as Gary D. will handle those. The Valley Crossing peninsula scenery is moving on from planning stages as the branch bridge / viaduct has been defined. Work will proceed from the inside out as access will be a challenge once scenery is complete on the outer areas. Bill H. repaired cars left on the BO track at IC yard and reported a missing truck pin that could cause interference if it landed in a switch point, etc. Keep a look out, but the part is otherwise not critical and can be replaced.

N Scale Layout: (Max McD.)

Progress made with paint and a bridge. Plans firming up for the purchase of an MRC Prodigy Advanced II DCC system. Work next month will focus on the staging yard.

For the Good of the Order:

We received a Thank You card in the mail from the Wesley UM Church.

Keith D. requested a donation from the Monongalia Historical Society, which expects to dissolve in the near future.

Richard T. reminded members of the National Narrow Gauge Convention coming to Pittsburgh mid-month. Several NMRA Division 2 members will present clinics and others have volunteered to staff the convention. Rich H. moved for adjournment, seconded by Frank B. Meeting adjourned at 7:29 pm.
